 - Four were HSIs
 - Texas (10) and Puerto Rico (6) had the largest most number of institutions
 - Hispanic concentration ranged from 19% to 100% but averaged 57% overall
- These 25 institutions awarded 42% of all associate degrees in engineering technology earned by Hispanics in 2006-07
